Young Audiences is seeking a new team member with a background in education, stellar organizational and interpersonal skills, and the ability to successfully juggle many tasks to support the implementation of The Right Brain Initiative. Young Audiences serves as the Implementation Partner for The Right Brain Initiative, a program of the Regional Arts & Culture Council (RACC), providing oversight for the delivery of arts-integrated residencies and services to partnering K-8 schools in the tri-county area.

Arts Integration Coaches guide schools through the design and implementation of Right Brain arts-integrated residencies including identifying goals, facilitating meetings, and coaching towards quality arts integration for classroom teachers and teaching artists.

Essential Position Responsibilities:

- Work directly with schools to identify, support, and assess school goals for arts-integrated residencies.
- Provide clear and consistent communications to partnering schools - including administrators, teachers, art specialists and instructional coaches - and teaching artists to support high quality arts-integrated residencies.
- Facilitate collaborative residency planning between teaching artists and classroom teachers.
- Coordinate the completion and collection of all documentation related to residencies.
- Work with the Right Brain Program Manager, Coach Team Lead and Teaching Artist Specialist to lead and co-lead Professional Learning Community opportunities for teaching artists.
- Engage collaboratively with the Right Brain team to support the program's vision and create a cohesive and respectful working environment.
- Facilitate Right Brain protocol during annual spring colloquium event.

- Knowledge of local school systems, structures and cultures and the ability to build relationships
