# Creativity in Action Aglimpse into a Parkrose School District classroom

SANSAN, BYRON, AND LUELLA are fourth graders at Prescott Elementary School. This year, their class participated in a Right Brain residency with a movement artist from Bodyvox. Using dance and movement to explore the book their class was reading together, the students related to the material and one another in new ways. They were engaged and creative in their thinking. "I was stretched out of my comfort zone," Luella says, and Sansan agrees: "Dancing made me feel like I was actually in the book we read."

Renee is their fourth grade teacher, and has been working in the Parkrose School District for 16 years. In that amount of time, recess, physical education, and art classes have been scaled down or cut entirely because of staffing and budget shortages. Without dedicated time for movement or creativity, the residency with Bodybox brought new opportunities

to Renee's classroom. "My class was studying climate change," Renee says, "so through movement we explored the environment with our bodies... what the ocean floor would feel like, what space would feel like, what you might find in a forest. We're giving students an opportunity to move and explore. This is an opportunity for everyone to be successful."

In partnership with The Right Brain Initiative,
Prescott Elementary is one of 70 schools across the
greater Portland metro region investing in professional
development and teaching artist residences that equip
educators with tools to bring arts integration strategies
into their classrooms. As she teaches every day, Renee
is an example across her school in using Right Brain
practices to engage and stimulate her students in fresh
ways. "They see that this is something different happening
in the classroom," Renee says, "and they're excited about
it." That's the power of The Right Brain Initiative.

Right Brain Arts Integration Specialists support teacher leadership teams by modeling arts-based instructional strategies, helping to connect strategies to artist residencies, and guiding teachers in adopting arts integration as an ongoing practice.

Teachers and artists collaboratively design a learning experience that connects an arts discipline with another subject. These residencies introduce new art forms—like drumming, dance, or printmaking—and allow students and teachers to learn directly from Right Brain teaching artists.


## **Our Impact**


